#### Dear Family,

Another HFFA reunion has come and gone. Albeit, this was not just another reunion. This was a special time together exalting our 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of HFFA. Additionally, we held it in the Hannibal/Palmyra, Missouri region where it all started 25 years ago in 1992. I wasn't your President then, but I had the privilege of being there. My oldest brother, **Bert Frye**, was the Founder and organizer of our organization along with some help from his son, our Vice President and Editor of the Journal, **Jon Frye**, and **Rich** and **Genevieve Frye**, local residents who are now deceased.

For our good members who were unable to be with us, I would like to review some of what we accomplished at our reunion.

We were blessed with good, sunny weather during our daylight hours. However, the night time hours, when a lot of people were in bed, was stormy with heavy rain and thunder and lightning. On June 14, Wednesday night, we opened with our Officer's and Board of Directors Business meeting at 7PM. We had minutes of the last reunion and reports and discussions of pertinent subjects. On Thursday, June 15, we had our general all-day Business meeting in the ballroom of Hannibal's finest lodging, the Quality Inn.

We had the President's Welcome followed by "The Birth of HFFA" presented by **Ann Pasieka, Marti Frye, Jon Frye** and myself. Later, we enjoyed a presentation by **Jon Frye**, "Quest for our European Roots". Then, we had a presentation "Frey Family German and Swiss Origins Through the New World Colonies" by Norm Schulze.

In the afternoon, we had family group pictures followed by discussion about the Frey Fort cemetery burials in Winchester, VA and "The Story, accompanied by cemetery description, gravestones and historical notes", a documentary film by Norm Schulze. Richard Frey gave a nice presentation, "All About DNA" and "Are you Using Find-A-Grave?".

Later in the afternoon, we had another presentation by Norm Schulze, "Heinrich Frey Cemetery Presentation Project". This was followed by our business meeting,

which included the minutes, treasurer's report, election of officers and old and new business. This included proposals for possible additional Frey Fort cemetery enhancements by **Norm Schulze**, which was put into abeyance at this point. Another proposal was arranging a Germany/ Switzerland Tour/HFFA meeting in the old country. **Jon Frye** introduced a request for funds to support the Swiss research of our ancestors and approval was reached for a limited amount.

At 7PM that evening, some of our group went in to Hannibal to enjoy "Music Under the Stars" near Mark Twain's homestead. Later that evening, several people enjoyed the hospitality room by exchanging lineages and visiting with old acquaintances and making new acquaintances.

On Friday, June 16, we started the day by boarding our coach for the day, equipped with a good loudspeaker and clean restroom, as we drove to Louisiana, which is in Pike County, Missouri, to visit the grave of James Frye Sr., circa 1750, born in Frederick County, VA, and died in Buffalo Township, Pike County, Missouri, in 1821. He was buried in Jordan-Buffalo Cemetery. We had David Hunter, one of the caretakers of the cemetery, as our speaker. We had a nice catered lunch at Huck Hall in Mark Twain State Park in Stoutsville, Missouri followed by a presentation of the era (1830-1860) of our Frye ancestors.

Dinner was on the Hannibal riverboat on the Mississippi River with a live band. We enjoyed hearing the calliope as we disembarked. Later in the evening, several people again visited the hospitality room to share their lineages.

On Saturday, June 17, we boarded our coach for a ride to the Mt. Zion Christian Church where we sang and were given refreshments. We took a nice group photo outside the church. In Palmyra, we took the Heritage Speaker's Trolley tour which included the Gardner House museum, the old Palmyra jail and court house. We had lunch at Hall's Hall. **Eddie Dray** led a tour of the historic Mark Twain cave. We walked across the parking lot from our hotel to the restaurant "Fiddlesticks" for a nice banquet dinner, followed by a raffle organized by **Janet** and **John Goforth**. If they could,

each family was asked to bring an item native from their state and the items were raffled off. The hospitality room was again open after the banquet.

The conclusion of our meeting was on Sunday morning, a church service, led by Jon Frye. He showed a video of Esther Frye's chalk drawing (his Mother), entitled "Snatched from the Fire". We adjourned and wished everyone a safe journey onward.

Ann Pasieka organized this reunion and we thank her for the hours spent in research and planning. Mike Speers writes this, his last newsletter, as our Editor and we thank him for doing a stellar job in its publication. We want to also thank him again for his diligence in guiding our family funds in the position of Treasurer. We welcome Marilyn Fry as the new editor of the newsletter, and she will be assisted by Gretchen Fry Harvey and Ginny Fry Santos. We also welcome Ralph Frye as the new Treasurer. We welcome Rebecca Mayfield and Richard W. Frey as new Board Members and thank both for offering their time. Thank you to all who volunteer their time and expertise to our family's heritage.

A decision has not yet been made for our 2019 reunion. A couple of places have been discussed but nothing is definite yet.

#### HFFA BUSINESS MEETING, JUNE 15, 2017 HANNIBAL, MISSOURI

At 3:50, Gene Frye opened the meeting. Gretchen Fry Harvey read the minutes of June 11, 2015, at the HFFA reunion in Morgantown, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. Norm Shultz moved to approve the minutes as read, seconded by Mike Speers, and a vote was taken; the minutes were approved unanimously.

Mike Speers gave the Treasurer's report. As of June 10, 2017, HFFA had a balance of \$9,983.89. He said that this amount would change as checks for the reunion come in or out. As of the financial audit of 2015, HFFA had a balance of \$15,485.48. Expenses since that audit total \$10,369.71. Expenses include HFFA Journal printing, postage, office expenses, website expenses, refunds, tour buses, Charles Burgess records, and the Frey Fort Cemetery Project. Donations to the Frey Fort Cemetery Plaque didn't quite cover all the costs, so HFFA provided the remaining cost of \$415.00.

## Ralph Frye moved to <u>accept the Treasurer's report</u> (second, Helen Craig), accepted unanimously.

Marti Frye thanked Mike Speers for his many years of service as HFFA Treasurer and as HFFA Newsletter Editor. Mike Speers said that he appreciates all that Membership Chair Marti Frye does. Gene Frye said that Mike Speers is a man without equal. He appreciates all his hard work through the years.

Old Business: None

#### **New Business:**

#### Computer Expense:

Richard Frey moved that <u>HFFA provide</u> about \$50.00 a year to pay for a carbonite back-up for Marti Frye's computer (second, Thelma McKenzie), approved unanimously.

Genealogist to Research Swiss and German Ancestors Earlier Than Heinrich Frey's Grandparents and Siblings: Jon Frye said that, when he went to Switzerland, he found a genealogist there, an older gentleman who can read old German. The man came highly recommended by the State Archives. Jon agreed. He contacted the man to find out his prices for such research. It would cost at least \$300.00 to \$500.00 or more, depending on how much we want him to do. We could ask for donations from members or take the money out of HFFA funds. The Swiss records are very good for centuries; this could be the chance of a lifetime. He proposed that we set up a donation fund.

Jon Frye moved to set up a donation fund to hire this Swiss genealogist to do research on the Frey family in Switzerland and Germany with HFFA back-up funds not to exceed \$200.00 (second, Gretchen Fry), approved unanimously.

Richard Frey announced a unanimous approval by the HFFA Board of Director's at last night's meeting to set up a PayPal account linked to the HFFA Website for easier payment of Association dues. The Treasurer will additionally set up separate accounts for various donation projects that will also be linked for easier payment through PayPal. Gretchen Fry Harvey said that she would donate the first \$100.00 to the Swiss research project.

**HFFA Journal:** Jon Frye said that he has tried to get three issues of the HFFA Journal out this year, but he can't keep up this pace. These past few years, he has been able to produce only two issues a year. After that, only one issue. He has an interest in World War I and would like a do a whole issue on family members who served in World War I. Ronald Ellis has sent him articles. He would appreciate others sending similar articles about their family members who served. He would welcome articles of any size; photographs would be particularly welcome.

Election of HFFA Officers: President Gene Frye said that almost all of the current officers have agreed to continue serving for the next two years: Gene Frye as President; Jon Frye as Vice President; Gretchen Fry Harvey as Secretary; and Ralph Frye, Janet Goforth, Thelma McKenzie, and Ann Pasieka as Directors at Large. Gene Frye

declared the floor is open for recommendations for any office, including these. Thelma McKenzie said that the HFFA By-Laws provide for five Directors at Large. She recommends that we add a fifth Director.

Thelma McKenzie moved to <u>elect Richard</u> <u>Frey as a Director at Large</u> (second, Rebecca Proffitt), approved unanimously.

Helen Craig moved that <u>we accept this</u> slate of HFFA Officers, including Richard <u>Frey as fifth Director at Large</u> (second, Ralph Frye), accepted unanimously.

Gene Frye said that we still need a Treasurer. This needs to be a responsible person. Mike Speers has agreed to continue to store the old copies of the HFFA Journal and to sell them to members, but he will no longer be Treasurer. Nominations are open for the two-year term of HFFA Treasurer.

Carolyn Fry moved to request that Ralph Frye resign as Director at Large and accept the position of HFFA Treasurer (second, Richard Frey), approved unanimously.

Ralph Frye at first said no; in his family Marti Frye handles the money; also she collects the dues and new memberships. She would be better for the position. Gene Frye reminded members that Marti Frye cannot be elected to a HFFA office because she is not a direct descendant of Heinrich Frey; she is married to a descendant. Her position as Membership Chairman is an appointed position. Ralph Frye then agreed to give up his position as Director at Large and accept the position of Treasurer.

Ralph Frye nominated Ronald Ellis for Director at Large, but Ronald Ellis declined.

Gerald Fry nominated Rebecca Proffitt to be HFFA Director at Large (second, Richard Frey), approved unanimously.

#### **Newsletter Editor:**

Gene Frye said that Mike Speers has agreed to produce the August HFFA Newsletter and asked Gretchen Fry Harvey to send Mike Speers the minutes of this meeting for the Newsletter. We have not

had any volunteers to serve as Newsletter Editor. Richard Frey said we should try to get someone in the next two days while we are all together; he reminded everyone that it is an appointed position so it does not have to be a direct descendant. [On Saturday, June 15, Marilyn Fry agreed to serve as HFFA Newsletter Editor with the assistance of her daughter, Gretchen Fry Harvey, and niece Ginny Fry Santos.]

Schedule for Friday, June 14, 2017: Anne Pasieka asked everyone to meet in front of the hotel promptly at 8:45 to get on the bus. She asked everyone to keep their name tags on; when people leave the reunion, they should return the name tags.

**HFFA Website:** Richard Frey said that the HFFA Website could be even greater if we could put in family stories; he does this with another website that he manages. He urged members to look at the website and to send him emails with suggestions and/or photographs. He will post photographs of this reunion. *Go to www.hfrey.org.* 

Heinrich Frey Cemetery Preservation **Project:** Norm Schultz gave a PowerPoint presentation on the Heinrich Frey Cemetery Presentation Project. Authority for the project was given at the 2015 Board Meeting at the reunion in Morgantown. Schantz, the current owner of the land at 2285 Kerr Road, Harleysville, Pennsylvania, will let us visit the grave sites. He showed us the reconciled deed with an easement allowing visits to the cemetery. Norm Schultz said that he volunteered to clean up this cemetery, but he ran into a problem. We need documentation that this land did actually belong to Heinrich Frey. Historian Charles Burgess is content that this is the correct location. However, a deed search is mandatory. Norm Schultz said that he discussed this issue with the HFFA Title Insurance Representative Gretchen Fry Harvey wasn't able to do a title search on the land going back that far in history, to the early 1700s. Norm Schultz said that he has looked into the law. This cemetery could disappear; it isn't on any map of the area. Legal rights are not the same in Pennsylvania as they are in Virginia. If we could put a permanent sign up, it is more likely that it could survive time. It would help if we could have the State of Pennsylvania designate it a historical burial site. However, the process is complex. It would be difficult but not impossible. About 100 years ago, there were signs here. Other researchers claim that Heinrich Frey is buried in the Bertolet Mennonite Cemetery in Frederick, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, where there is a monument to him; we saw it in 2015. It is listed there in Find-A Grave, too. However, as we saw, this memorial has some factual errors. Jon Fry said that the information on it came from the Wallenberg account.

Unfortunately, we don't have proof that this land, now belonging to Allen Schantz, ever belonged to Heinrich Frey. He owned 500 acres in Pennsylvania, but we don't know if it included this land. Norm Schultz said that he has 110 pages of notes and documentation. However, he needs help in order to go further, and we need to hire a genealogist to find a record that Heinrich Frey died on this land. Gene Frye agreed that, if this is where he is buried, HFFA needs to do something as an organization.

Gretchen Fry Harvey suggested hiring a researcher to do research to find out if Heinrich Frey owned this land, but the first step is to determine the cost of this work. Ann Pasieka said that Gerald Fry did some research by going into the court house. Gretchen Fry Harvey said that there might not be any records, but there probably is a record. Rebecca Proffitt suggested that we set up a donation fund. Mike Speers said that it is risky to rely on donations. We set up a donation fund for the Frey Fort Cemetery Plaque Project, but we came up a bit short, and HFFA had to pay to finish it. We could set up a similar fund and designate \$500.00 from the treasury.

Gretchen Fry Harvey moved to approve \$300 of HFFA funds to research the land where the easement is designated (second, Linda King), approved unanimously.

Frey Fort Cemetery Enhancement Proposal, 2017: Norm Schultz gave a presentation on further work to be done at the Frey Fort Cemetery. He said that he had sent his proposal to President Gene Frye in April 2016. Maintenance is needed for the cemetery. The site needs a periodic cleanup, and we need to fix the sunken areas. We need to restore the old tombstones. We

need to establish who is buried there behind the 46 sites; 19 tombstones are missing.

Norm Schultz recommended that we do these things:

- 1. Candidate Burials Project (detailed research project)
- 2. Location Determination of All Gravesites Project (map out the cemetery by Ground Penetrating Radar)
- 3. Survey of Burial Sites Project (fill in depressions, relocate markers, build a fence around cemetery)
- 4. Site Cleanup (need volunteers/work crew to cut down small trees, clear roots, and vegetation)
- Tombstone and stone markers protection (repair stones and place stone markers for those missing)
- 6. Site Integration Project Manager (one HFFA member in charge)

Thelma McKenzie said that the kind of fence that the current Frey Fort owners want is too expensive. Richard Frey also disagreed to many of these recommendations.

Richard Frey moved that <u>HFFA be</u> responsible for cleaning up the Frey Fort Cemetery once a year and cutting down the young trees, asking for volunteers to cut down the saplings (second, Judy Fry), approved unanimously.

Jon Frye recommended that we put the other Frey Fort recommendations on hold at this time—to be strongly considered at a later time. Thelma McKenzie said that we have just approved two big projects; those are enough for our small organization.

Norm Schultz made a proposal to form a task force to produce a HFFA archives system to secure and preserve family data, historical documents, and records. We need to locate a suitable permanent storage place and to list and catalogue the material electronically so that we can all access it for future research. HFFA Historian Charles Burgess has very valuable genealogical data. Former HFFA Director Hank Williams has some documentation. Susan Salmon volunteered to head up a task force.

Gene Frye declared the business meeting closed at 5:45 p.m.

#### Summary of Hannibal Reunion Events

The Heinrich Frey Family Association (HFFA) Reunion was held in Hannibal, Missouri, June 15-18, 2017, organized by Anne Pasieka, a descendant of William Keller Fry, son of Benjamin Fry, whose father was James Fry, who migrated to Missouri from Kentucky in 1819. James Fry settled in Pike County, but Benjamin and his family settled in Marion County in Palmyra, seven miles north of Hannibal. Eight years later, after helping his father, Benjamin, on the farm in Palmyra, son John Fry joined his second cousin Aaron Fry in Frytown, which today is part of Hannibal (the Steamboat Bend Mall), where he lived until his death in 1884 in the famous Fry's Garden (he and his wife, Mary Jane Leighton Fry are buried in Riverside Cemetery in Hannibal).

Thursday, June 15, we spent the day in the meeting room at the Quality Inn in Hannibal, Missouri. HFFA President Gene Fry welcomed everyone, and he, Marti Frye, John Frye, and Anne Paesieka gave a short presentation on "The Birth of HFFA and Who Knows Who." This was followed by a slide presentation by Jon Frye about his recent trip to Switzerland: "Quest for our European Roots." Norm Schultz gave a slide presentation on "Frey Family: German and Swiss Origins to the New World Colonies." Lunch was provided by HFFA good Panera box lunches. lunch, Norm Schultz showed a video of "Frey Fort Cemetery Burials Plaque Installation Project." April 13, 2016, Norm Schultz; Dr.

Richard Bell and his wife, Sue, and son Dan; and Phil Wingert went to Frey Fort in Fredericksburg, Virginia, where they cemented in four corner cement markers with F on them and installed the bronze plaque listing the names of all the people we know about who are buried there, including Benjamin, son of Heinrich, and Benjamin's wife, Christina. After that presentation, Richard Frey gave a slide presentation on DNA and on Find-A-Grave. The business meeting, where officers were elected, was held from 3:50 until 5:45 p.m.

That night and every night we were there, we could observe a spectacular thunder, lightening, wind, and rain storm. Fortunately, it always cleared up by the following morning. It was clear the next day, Friday, June 16, when we boarded the bus at 8:45 for a trip to Louisiana, Missouri, in Pike County, where James Fry settled after coming from Kentucky. We went to the Jordan-Buffalo Cemetery, where James Fry, Sr., and his son James are buried. David Hunter, whose family donated the land for the cemetery, was there to talk about the cemetery and the people buried there. He is descended on both his mother's and his father's side from James Fry, Jr. In the last two years, he has replaced some of the old limestone markers with nice big granite ones. Both of the James Fry markers are now large, standing, reddish-granite standing headstones.

After we left Buffalo, we went to Huck Hall at Mark Twain State Park in Florida, Monroe County, Missouri, and had a hot buffet lunch prepared by some friends of Ann Pasieka. Then the bus took us to the Mark Twain Birthplace Museum, where we saw a film and heard a presentation by Marianne Bodine, one of the State Park Interpreters. The actual small wooden house where Mark Twain (Samuel Clemens) was born is incorporated

into the museum. When he was three, his family moved to Hannibal, where he grew up. We returned to the hotel in the afternoon, in time for people to visit downtown Hannibal if they wanted to see the Mark Twain Boyhood House, Museum, and other related buildings. Then at 6:00 p.m., we all took the bus to the Mark Twain Riverboat for a two-hour dinner cruise on the Mississippi River.

On Saturday, June 17, we took the bus again and visited the Mt. Zion Christian Church on the outskirts of Hannibal, where the Frys had worshiped in the past. Reverend Steve Bouman told us about the church and led a short service with singing of hymns, including "Lily of the Valley" with lyrics by Charles Wesley Fry (1837-1882) and music by William S. Hays (1837-1907). Then we had a hot buffet lunch in downtown Palmyra at Hall's Hall. After that, half of the group took the Heritage Seekers Trolley Tour of Palmyra while the rest of the group visited the Gardner House Museum, where David Hastings led a tour of the Then the two groups museum. changed places. As we left town, Anne pointed out the Greenwood Cemetery, where many Frys are At 6:30, we all went to Fiddlesticks for a banquet followed by games and the raffle of items brought by members, conducted by Janet and John Goforth.

On Sunday morning, June 18, Jon Frye gave a service in the Hospitality Room of the Quality Inn with a film of his mother's religious chalk drawings.
