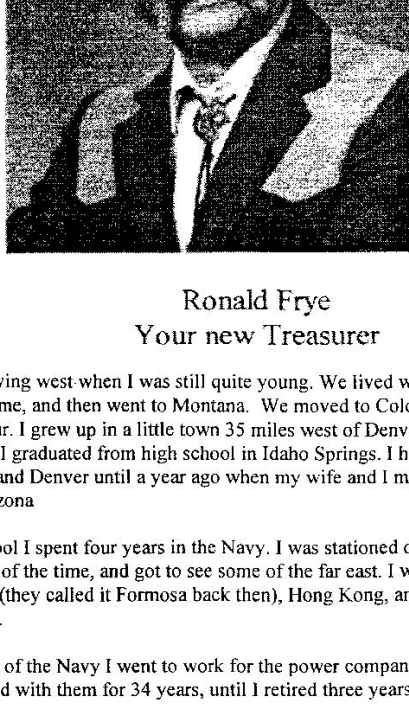
Please bear with us as we go through the transition of these offices.

When I got out of the Navy I went to work for the power company in Denver. I stayed with them for 34 years, until I retired three years ago.

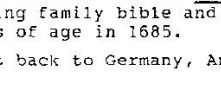

## Letters to the Editor

Dear Will:

You asked if it would be possible to come up with reliable dates for Heinrich Frey.

I know of no primary source in this country that gives his birthdate. Even the ship's passenger list for the "Frances and Bismarck" fails to give an age for him.

Therefore we have to turn to Europe for a record. In the *Bismarck* for Althaus, across the Rhine from Strasbourg, France, there is a record of Heinrich Frey, born 7 June 1853, the son of Jacob Frey and Anna Hirtzler, seems to be our Heinrich. Jacob was the son of Friedrich Frey in Guntersville, Canton Aargau, in Switzerland. Jacob and Anna were married 26 Jan 1857 in Althaus. The record of caution. There is no proof this Anna Heinrich is our Heinrich. The marriage certificate dated 26 April 1892, for Heinrich Frey and Anna Catherine Leeder (in the manuscript collection of the Pennsylvania Historical Society) says that Heinrich was from Althaus in Aargau. If a record could be found for him between 1855 (after which the family evidently left Althaus) and 1865 (when Heinrich arrived in Philadelphia), it might help to prove if this is a Heinrich.

Most writers give Heinrich's death as 1734. That is the year he and Anna Catherine deeded the Towauncin farm to their son, Jacob. In return for his having care of them and their three youngest daughters. Since there is no estate record for Heinrich in Philadelphia, it can not be determined exactly when he died.

Anna Catherine's birth date of March 1676 is from the 1859 writing of Moravia Gates Jones titled *The Leveering Family*. He makes reference to a Leveering family bible and also gives a source that says Anna was 9 years of age in 1685.

In a report sent back to Germany, Anna was living in July of 1744.

Now for a Frey family brain teaser: There was a Frey who married a Fry, but how closely she was related to him, I do not know. Among her children, this Fry couple had a son and a daughter, each in turn married a distant cousin, also named Fry. These distant cousins were first cousins, since their fathers were brothers. Now the teaser, your relationship was the son's daughter to the daughter's son?
