HFFA Minutes

The Business Meeting of the HFFA was called to order at 2:05 pm on Saturday June 26, 2009 in Golden, TX.

President Charles Burgess welcomed everyone and thanked Tommy Wiggins and family for hosting the reunion in Mineola, TX. Approximately thirty-four members and guests were present to enjoy the Golden Community Center and Best Western accommodations.

The minutes from the 2007 reunion in Iowa were emailed previous to the meeting. There were no additions or corrections and were approved unanimously.

Reports:

The treasurer's report was presented with a 2007 beginning balance of \$3426.48. Ending balance through June 15, 2009 was \$2131.91. Motion to approve by Helen Craig, second by Chris Frye, approved.

Journal editor Jon Frye reported he is working on the next issue and will include the report from the current Mineola reunion.

Newsletter editor Mike Speers reported that he welcomes suggestions for articles and anything members wish to submit. He asked members to comment on any relevant issue, examples: the privacy issue, why did you get into genealogy. Let Mike know what's happening with your family tree work.

HFFA Board meeting report:

1. Norm Shultz will be hosting the 2011 reunion in Virginia. His program suggestions include a tour of Frey Fort, house and cemetery.
2. Tentative reunions are set for Ohio in 2013 and St. Joseph, MO in 2015
3. Links book: Dues were increased two years ago to help cover the cost of the links book. Updates have been sent out. Over 70 copies were sent hard copy. Printing and mailing costs are going up. Wil Frye noted that this can all be put on a CD with less cost. The Board approved to send a CD to new members instead of a hard copy. Wil stated that only sections 1 thru 4 and Harry Morrison's chart will be on the CD. Updates will be available every year via CD, if you ask for one. Members can print the copy themselves from the CD or can order a hard copy from Wil for \$55.00.
4. Website: is expensive (because we use so much space) and we want to

move to a free site. It was decided to close down the members' only section, not have back issues of newsletters, journals or the roster on the site. The index to articles will stay. The first six generations will be available. Site is:

A REUNION AT JOHNSON SPACE CENTER

Joan and I flew to Houston 17 July 09 to attend the Johnson Space Center's Engineering Directorate's celebration of the 40th Anniversary of the Apollo Program's Lunar Lander, the Eagle, safely touching down on the surface of the moon during the Apollo 11 Mission.

I have got to say that this was one of the most spiritually rewarding events of my life. I came close to not putting forth the effort to go, and for us, so far away in Virginia, the trip was, indeed, quite an effort.

I had worked on Mercury, Gemini, Apollo, Shuttle, plus many other NASA unmanned programs, including aeronautical programs. Stations to which I reported included the Langley Research Center, the Johnson Space Center, and Headquarters. At JSC I worked in the Propulsion Division, among other offices. Many old colleagues and I chatted for the first time in nearly a quarter of a century; for others, it was close to a half century. Joan and I were among the first NASA employees to arrive in Houston where we had initially worked until site completion.

Joan started the library at the Manned Spacecraft Center (MSC), as JSC was initially known. I remarked to her after much time had passed during this trip, there is no way I could have conveyed to you the spiritual nature of this trip. I believe that the experience I had was quite different, that is, more profound than for one who is there and lives it all the time.

We toured the Space Center Houston museum located in front of NASA for the first time. The University of Houston, NASA Campus, held a special event to commemorate this historic event, one for all mankind. A few of us Apollo Alumni were in the auditorium and were requested to stand for recognition by a former Flight Director, Glynn Lunney before he said anything else. We even got to go into the house that I designed and built in Baytown, TX, the purchaser still being the resident since 1975.

Joan and I scheduled a Monday, 20 July, afternoon departure just to hear the first part of the overall, week long, JSC program to remember Apollo 11. Four managers were there to discuss some memories. I wanted to attend more, but it was after midnight by the time we got back home in Virginia.

AN OHIO TWIG

Newark, Ohio is a decent place to live. Although I have a Newark address, my family and I consider ourselves more part of the Granville community, the home of Denison University.

My 4th great grandfather, **Samuel Frey Jr.** b. 19 Mar 1762, d. 9 Apr. 1848, husband of **Rachel Jones**, son of **Samuel Frey Sr.** b. 13 Mar. 1727, grandson of **John Frey** b. 1700 (Frey Bible), great grandson of **Heinrich**, moved to the area in the early part of the 1800s, and is buried at Beulah Cemetery, which is only about 10 miles away. His son, **David, Frey**, my 3rd ggf, stayed in the area, while others moved away, such as another son of his, **Rev. James Frey Sr.** who moved to Iowa.

I took over as family historian for my twig of the Frey family about 10 years ago when my great aunt **Ruth Frey Atwood** died. While she was alive, she taught me how to do record searches and the basics of genealogy. I think she would be blown away with the information at our finger tips now with the use of the internet.

I inherited her thousands of pages of genealogy work on the Frey family. The original collection encompasses properly documented Frey information with sources, photos, and correspondence letters to numerous Freys across the country.

The last Frey project she was working on before she died, was specific information on the **Rev. James Frey Sr.** She had half the puzzle, primarily info about his first wife and their children here in Ohio.

She knew his first wife died and he went on to marry a second and they had more children in Iowa. From correspondence and investigation she got the names of the children from his second marriage, several of the children were marked with question marks indicating the absence of source information to fully establish the relationship. Then she got sick and did not have the ability to fully complete her project.

When I came into possession of her years of work, I was in the midst of finishing pharmacy school. I had a newborn and a young daughter of two. I was glad to be left the records and vowed to protect and preserve them. I eventually began a few small projects and worked up to a challenging one.

About three years ago, I heard about the **National Geographic Genome Project**. This project was created to trace early migration patterns of man. Being a scientist and interested in genetics, I found the web site, ordered a kit, then submitted a sample. I initially had no hint that it may help people with the same surname to connect to one another. Then, out of the blue last year, I got a match with a person with the same last name.

Richard Frey, a retired attorney from Fresno California, shot me an email. He provided some basic information about his line and asked if I knew any information.

I advised him to give me a few weeks to see what I could dig up, it actually ended up taking me a month.

Clarification and verification concerning his info increased our correspondence between one another for several weeks. Then one night, or should I say morning, I found it. I was so excited I wanted to call him that moment!

We were finally able to show the connection and relationship. His ancestor, **Smith Frey**, was the son of **Rev. James Frey Sr.** who I mentioned above as a brother of my direct descendant **David Frey**. I was excited that I could forward copies of some photos to him. Richard Frey was then able to find some additional information on his own concerning Smith Frey and he wasted no time in forwarding it on to me.

My great Aunt Ruth Frey was working on this twig before she got sick then later died. I could feel her spirit with me as her leg of the project was completed.
