FR(E)Y(E) DNA

Dear Mike,

I was reading the newsletters that you were so kind to have sent me and found a comment regarding DNA testing that intrigued me. Basically, there was a note (something to the effect) that there has not been any real success in merging DNA results with known Frey genealogical lines. This is exactly what I have been working on since our previous conversation.

Specifically, I have been building a Frey (all spelling variants) facebook group page. The purpose of this group is to help advertise the need to disentangle the various Fry lines via DNA testing. We also discuss all kinds of relevant topics related to the various Fry family lines (not just the Heinrich Frey Line). I have added links to the Heinrich Frey Family Association, FamilyTreeDNA, WorldFamilies.net and other resources.

In addition, I have fostered an affiliation with another site that has been collecting **Fr(e)y(e) DNA** information and providing a forum for people to input their data and interface the DNA results with their Earliest Known Ancestor genealogical information/trees. The results have been extremely promising. That is to say, very distinct Frey lines have emerged and if sufficient people become involved, we will eventually be able to identify which lines people belong to on the basis of their **Y-DNA** results and/or their **autosomal/BETA DNA** results from Ancestry.com. This is a huge breakthrough for Frey family specific genealogical research (across, as well as within, lines).

There are many people who suspect that they belong to certain Fry lines, but have no proof one way or another. Likewise there are many who believe that they are descended from a broader line (or cousin line) because they can not find their specific progenitor in a family tree. The DNA/genealogical network we are building will provide a tool for people to determine where they belong and then to join the correct family line specific association (such as yours).

I am asking you to consider posting our Frey Family Facebook page: <https://www.facebook.com/groups/476640749067121/> in your newsletter. This is a closed group to which anyone interested can join if they request.

Likewise, I would really appreciate it if you encouraged your members (particularly those with DNA results) to the join the "Fry-ing Pan" website: <http://fryingpan.redheadkelly.net/> This is the site where the real DNA/genealogy matching can occur. It does not matter where the DNA testing took place. We are working on a way to accommodate and make the most of everyone's results. It is also a wonderful site for those who are interested in DNA testing and would appreciate an unbiased assessment of which test they should use/purchase to meet their desired goals. I am currently the administrator (mostly managing the DNA results) for the R1b-Lineage I group. This is the line we suspect to be the Heinrich Frey, from Alsace, Family Line.

I hope we can continue to work together. I think "cross-pollination" in this way, will help us all achieve our desired goals.

1. Birth, 20 Oct **1809**
2. **1830** - Marriage to John Nicholas Miller
3. Death - **1870**
4. **1880** - Residence in Elizabeth, Allegheny Co., Pennsylvania
