In the May newsletter we introduced you to the Joseph Fry family on page 9 in the first photo. In the front row we see Eva Constance Fry, the first little girl on the left in the picture. Some of her relatives questioned the date of death that I mentioned in the caption. The correct date has been found. She was known as Aunt Connie to HFFA member **Shirley Coad** who provided us with the following information.

b. Oct. 4, 1876 Iroquois County, IL

d. Jan. 13, 1969 Winfield, Cowley Co., KS

md. James Albert Benjamin, Jan. 30 1895, Winfield, Cowley Co., KS

b. Feb. 28, 1867 Bloomington, Iroquois Co., IL

d. Sep 9, 1940 (probably Winfield, Cowley Co., KS)

We also thank **Janet Goforth** for telling us that Eva's oldest sister, **Emma Ardella Fry** passed away in 1917, not 1927 as reported in the same photo caption in the last newsletter. This information was in her grandmother's handwriting. Her

grandmother was **Hattie May Fry**, another sister of Eva.

By the way, **Shirley Coad** and **Janet Goforth** are sisters and are both members of HFFA.

Message from the President

The publisher and editor of the White Leader, where my Burgess grandparents lived, had a column she called Cacklings by the Old Hen. I guess you could call this Rumbings by the Old Goat. Goats must rumble some when they eat tin cans. We had a neighbor whose dog clinked when it ran. The dog swallowed chunks of metal. Guess he was lacking iron in his diet.

Now that summer is almost over, I hope many of you were able to make that trip to that forgotten burial place to find your ancestors. Perhaps you went to the court house on a search for records.

What do you do when you discover Great Aunt Sadie's tombstone says she died in 1941 when you are certain it was 1940? The clipping of her obit tucked in the family bible doesn't give the year because the date of the paper was at the top of the page and not preserved. Are there internment records for the cemetery? They would show the date she was buried. Are the records of the funeral home still extant? A copy of her death certificate would have the date of her death. Perhaps someone kept the memorial card handed out at her funeral. Don't be surprised if you find the tombstone was incorrect.

Tracing ancestors and family history can be a life long occupation. Don't feel guilty if you put it off for periods of time. But do enjoy it when the brick walls will let you.

Did You get Your DNA Checked yet?

The children of **E. Paul Frye** presented him with a gift of a check on his DNA. Paul sent me a copy of the page he received from the company that did the testing. From that I was able to view the list of those whose DNA were perfect matches. Including Paul, there were four whose matching DNA shows they are descendants of Heinrich. There was also one who was a close match indicating our most recent common ancestor lived some generations before Heinrich.

All four of the exact matches are now members of HFFA. None of them attended our reunion in Des Moines, Iowa where a half dozen or so indicated they intended to have their DNA checked. It is still not too late to do that.

I had talked and corresponded with the near match several years ago and again last week. We are still no closer to finding his first American Frye ancestor. We think it may be possible he is descended from a **Barberry Frye** of Jessamine, Kentucky whose wife was **Zilpha Swigert**. The name is also spelled Barney, Bernard, Barnhardt, and Bernard.

Does anyone know anything about this man and his parents?
