A few years ago a there was a discussion of the documentation of Heinrich Frey's arrival. It was recalled that the original document was in the possession of the Pennsylvania Historical Society and the first publication of the data was made by the Society in their bulletin "The Pennsylvania Magazine of History and Biography" Vol. VIII, 1884, pp 328-340.

In 1975, Michael Tepper, an editor at Genealogical Publishing the Company, Baltimore. MD consolidated of all the ship lists from the passenger Pennsylvania Magazine and "Emigrants published to Pennsylvania, 1641-1819".

Now you can read the original. Go to http://www.archive.org/index.php
Use the complete name for your site search, THE PENNSYLVANIA MAGAZINE OF HISTORY AND BIOGRAPHY and limit the search to TEXTS.

For those without internet access here is the entry from pp 337,338, names spelled as in original:
