Nancy Ellen Adams **1958 - 2005**

While on a phone conversation with **Norm Schulze**, we began talking about **Hank Adams** and all his genealogy records. It was thought that his daughter **Nancy Adams** had control of them, but we didn't know where she was or what she did with them. It was known that she was a world renowned expert on various insects and worked for the Smithsonian Institution. Norm did some checking and found the accompanying obituary for Nancy.

Her father, **Hank Adams**, was known by everyone in HFFA. He died in 2002 after his own bout with cancer. He was a real treasure to know and work with. Rose and I visited him at his home in Fort Walton Beach, FL and saw at least 10 four-drawer filing cabinets full of genealogy information. Anyone who contacted Hank would receive volumes of information from his files. He would have them measured so that when he sent things, we would know that the files he sent were measured by the inch. If I totaled all the things he sent, I'd probably have a foot of genealogy documents sent to me by Hank.

To this day, when I peruse my paper documents, I'll find a myriad of things sent by Hank, and it always brings a smile to my face.

Here is the obituary for Nancy that Norm found. It comes from a document published by **Scarab Workers: World Directory** out of the University of Nebraska - Lincoln State Museum - Division of Entomology. Nancy worked in Washington DC and lived in McLean, VA.



Nancy Adams
21 Apr 1958 - 20 Aug 2005

Nancy Adams was the contact person at the U. S. National Collection (Smithsonian Institution) for Aphodiinae, Scarabaeinae and other families not at the "Smithsonian West" (University of Nebraska State Museum). She had just finished inventorying the 320 drawers of scarabaeines at the USNM for a searchable database when she was diagnosed with cancer in December 2004. She passed away on 20 August 2005.

Nancy was born in Pensacola, FL on 21 April 1958. She spent her first 20 years growing up in Fort Walton Beach, FL where she graduated from Choctawhatchee High School in 1976 and Oskaloosa-Walton Community College with an AA degree in 1978. From there she transferred to Lookout Mountain College, GA, graduating with a BA degree in biology in 1981.

She was a teacher/naturalist at the Chattanooga Nature Center and the first teacher/naturalist at Landmark Park in Dothan, AL.

In 1983, Nancy started her career in the Entomology Department at the Smithsonian Institution's National Museum of Natural History. During her years there, she enjoyed collecting trips to Canada, Peru, and Trinidad. On her own, she enjoyed visiting insect collections in London, Mexico, Hawaii and dozens of university collections in the continental U.S. learning from and sharing with colleagues techniques on insect

collection management and data and transaction management. She also enjoyed having two catalogues published on parts of insect collection she managed. She has at least eight insects named for her. Nancy was one of the principal "go-to" people at the National Museum responsible for scarabs.

The Loss of the USS Akron

USS Akron (ZRS-4) was a helium-filled rigid airship of the U.S. Navy which operated between September 1931 and April 1933. She was the world's first purpose-built flying aircraft carrier, carrying F9C Sparrowhawk fighter planes which could be launched and recovered while she was in flight. With an overall length of 785 ft (239 m), the *Akron* and her sister airship the *Macon* were among the largest flying objects ever built. Although the LZ129 *Hindenburg* and her sister ship the LZ130 *Graf Zeppelin II* were some 18 ft (5.5 m) longer and slightly more

voluminous, the two German airships were filled with hydrogen, so the US Navy craft still hold the world record for helium-filled airships.

The *Akron* was destroyed in a thunderstorm off the coast of New Jersey on the morning of 4 April 1933, killing 73 of the 76 crewmen and passengers. This accident involved the greatest loss of life in any known airship crash.

On the evening of 3 April 1933, the *Akron* cast off from the mooring mast to operate along the coast of New England, assisting in the calibration of radio direction finder stations. Rear Admiral Moffett was on board along with his aide, Commander Henry Barton Cecil, **Commander Fred T. Berry**, the commanding officer of Lakehurst Naval Air Station and a graduate of the Naval Academy, and Lieutenant Colonel Alfred F. Masury, U.S. Army Reserve, a guest of the admiral, the vice-president of Mack Trucks, and a strong proponent of the potential civilian uses of rigid airships.

The *Akron* soon encountered severe weather, which did not improve when the airship passed over Barnegat Light, New Jersey at 10:00 pm as wind gusts of terrific force struck its massive airframe. While the control gondola was still hundreds of feet high, the lower fin of *Akron* had struck the water and was torn off.

The *Akron* broke up rapidly and sank in the stormy Atlantic. The crew of the nearby German merchant ship *Phoebus* saw lights descending toward the ocean at about 12:23 a.m. and altered course to starboard to investigate, with her captain believing that he was witnessing an airplane crash.

The crew of the *Phoebus* combed the ocean in boats for over five hours in a fruitless search for survivors. The Navy blimp *J-3* — sent out to join the search — also crashed, with the loss of two men.

Aftermath of Loss

Akron 's loss spelled the beginning of the end for the rigid airship in the US Navy, especially since one of its leading proponents, Rear Admiral William A. Moffett, was killed with 72 other men. As President Roosevelt commented afterward:

"The loss of the Akron with its crew of gallant officers and men is a national disaster. I grieve with the Nation and especially with the wives and families of the men who were lost. Ships can be replaced, but the Nation can ill afford to lose such men as Rear Admiral William A. Moffett and his shipmates who died with him upholding to the end the finest traditions of the United States Navy."

The loss of the *Akron* was the largest loss of life in any airship crash.

The USS *Macon* and other airships received life jackets to avert a repetition of this tragedy. When *Macon* was damaged in a storm in 1935 and subsequently sank after landing in the sea 70 of the 72 crew were saved.

Commander Fred Thomas Berry was one of the officials who was aboard the *Akron* on this horrible flight. He is a descendant of **Heinrich Frey**. You can read the entire story on the history of the *Akron* on Wikipedia.

Cinderella

It has been shown on these pages that **Socrates** and **Hercules** are part of the Frey family, now we have learned that **Cinderella** is a member of one of our related families, the Fromans.

Cinderella Idabelle McNair (1864 - 1946) married **Charles Bradsley Froman** (1861 - 1937). She was a widow and had five children in a ten year marriage to **Charles Hoffman** (1857 - 1894). Upon his death she married Mr. Froman and had one more child, **Joseph Ernest Froman** (1901 - 1925), who died in a car accident when he was 24. They lived in Memphis, TN.

In the obituary for **Cinderella** there were no mentions of glass slippers or evil step-sisters. Her natural sisters were named **Victoria, Drucilla, Mary, and Nellie**. In the obit on Find-a-grave, there is a picture of **Cinderella** and **Drucilla**. They seem very happy and loving.

Capon Springs

I knew the place featured on the cover looked familiar as soon as I picked up my new copy of **WV Living** magazine. It was the **Capon Springs and Farms Resort** we visited during the 2011 reunion in Frederick County, VA. In addition to the cover, the resort was featured on four pages of the **Spring 2015** magazine with beautiful pictures of the buildings including the spring house.

Credited with being the first European to discover the spring is **Heinrich Frey's** grandson **Henry**, son of **Benjamin** and **Christina** of **Frye Fort**. The story is recounted in the 1897 **History of Hampshire County, West Virginia: From Its Earliest Settlement to the Present** by Hu Maxwell and Howard Llewellyn Swisher as follows:

*“Long before the beginning of this century a man named Henry Frye had discovered the springs and made some improvements. While hunting one day on the mountain side, near the springs, he killed a large bear. Gathering up such a portion of his game as he could carry, he started for camp. Before he had proceeded very far, however, he became thirsty and throwing down his burden he descended into the glen in search of water. He found a large spring, from which he cleared away the moss and leaves and then satisfied his thirst. The temperature and peculiar taste of the water led him to suspect its medicinal value. When during the following summer, his wife was afflicted with rheumatism, he decided to take her to this place to see if a cure could not be effected. He built a small cabin and removed with his wife thither. This was undoubtedly the first improvement of the place and was made perhaps about the year 1765, although there is no definite record of the date. The place was for many years known as **Frye's Springs** in honor of the discoverer.”*

The narrative continues to say that in 1787 20 acres "around and including the spring was laid off into lots and streets. The place was named Watson. . . . **Henry Frye** was on the first board of trustees along with **Elias Poston, Isaac Hawk, Jacob Hoover, John Winterton, Valentine Swisher, Rudolph Bumgarner, Paul M'Ivor, John Sherman Woodcock and Isaac Zane.**"

Lana Sue Russell of HFFA in recounting our reunion for the Spring 2011 HFFA Journal notes that **George Washington** helped survey the area in the 1750s when he was 18 so he may have had a drink there even before our Henry.



This sign is on the Spring House at Capon Springs. The first claim on the springs came from Henry Frye who named them "Frye's Chalybeate Springs."

There was a legal tussle over the naming and ownership of the springs that resulted in the state of Virginia denying all claims and retaining an interest in the "Medicinal Springs." The state denied grants to all parties. Frye relinquished his claim. The trustees of Watson-Town laid claim to the land surrounding the spring and reserved the spring for the use of the general public.

After including the **QUERY**, from **Katherine Hollingsworth** found on page 6, I decided to look for her grandmother **Italia DeJarnette** on Find A Grave and came across a most interesting obituary. I've decided to share it with you. **Italia** is one of our cousins and it is important for us to meet her. - **Mike**

"Italia was born in Louisville, Kentucky, on February 22, 1891, her utmost desire was to be a veterinarian; her mother told her she had only two choices "you can be a doctor or a lawyer". At the tender age of five she took the pledge with Susan B. Anthony at the Women's Club of San Jose and has worked on behalf of women's rights to vote and for temperance since. She was one of the earliest registered social workers in California.

"Some of her proudest moments though came from her involvement in sports activities: tennis, basketball, rowing, swimming and fencing. She held several swim records and won fencing championships for five years. She was active in AAUW on and off since 1925.

"Italia really lived for sports during her college years. The restricting gym cloths which were the custom of the 1900's never deterred her. She was on the rowing crew at Cal for 6 years, and was instrumental in obtaining male coaches for female athletes.

*"She received her BA from University of California in 1912. Two years later, in 1914 ,she was the only woman among the class of 16 receiving the Juris Doctorate. Among her fellow graduates was **Earl Warren**, later **Chief Justice of the U.S. Supreme Court.***

*"By the mid 1920's, Italia had married and migrated to Florida. Her husband, **William H. Hollingsworth** was professor of political science at University of Florida. He died in 1928.*

"After her husband's passing, she returned to Berkeley, where she worked for the Red Cross 13 years before returning to her law

practice. She enjoyed the field of tax law because "it brings to the lawyer a feeling of being useful."

"In the summer of 1928, she worked as a volunteer in the Social Work Department of the Berkeley Police under Chief August Vollmer. There she helped prepare a talk for police leaders on "Legal Knowledge for Policewomen" and worked on the M.O. (Modus operandi) sheets that are now used around the world.

"The proof of the fullness and richness of her own life lies in the scrapbooks she faithfully kept over the years; some with clippings dating to the 1880's. Lawyer, teacher, athlete, social worker, tax specialist, Italia was also active in the Baptist Church. Her legal hobbies would consist of trying to outwit Perry Mason while reading her favorite Earle Stanley Gardner mysteries. Italia was a member of the D.A.R. and Queens Bench, Berkeley Bar Association."

She died 23 Sep 1982 in San Jose, CA. She was the mother of **Eloise Hollingsworth Eddy** and **William Wiley Hollingsworth**. She was also survived by four grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

She was an active member of the California State Bar Association, Queen's Bench of San Francisco, Grace Baptist Church of San Jose, D.A.R. and G.A.R., American Association of University Women, and a registered Social Worker.
